- -Misc. i.e. bath fixtures, cabinets, rugs, garage doors, lawn mowers, railroad ties, disassembled swing sets, metal fencing
- -Storm windows, glass panes. To prevent injury, please place a

large "X" in masking tape across glass panes and stack separately from other bulky items.

NON-ALLOW-ABLE ITEMS:



- -Trash in bags or boxes
- -Commercial or business trash or waste
- -Piles of stuff, bags or boxes of smaller items
- -Loose or scattered materials
- -Closed drums or fuel tanks, metal drums must have both ends removed to be collected
- -Automobile bodies or gas tanks
- -Loose building materials and lumber

Proper disposal is important to keep hazardous waste out of our landfills and waterways. Fortunately Kansas City offers Household Waste Facilities that will take these items for

free and properly recycle them to protect the environment. For Kansas City residents, drop-offs are accepted at the water department's facility at 4707 Deramus Avenue. Residents may drop off items every Thursday, Friday & Saturday. Allowable items include: automotive products, batteries, fertilizer, oil, sol-

vents, old paint, pool chemicals, anti-freeze and other toxins.

Morningside CID FAQ's

"What is the CID?"

A CID is an economic development tool that ensures fair and equitable payment from every homeowner. CID funds would be used for neighborhood upkeep and provision of services for neighborhood.

"Can I see the full petition?"

The full petition can be obtained from MNA President, Donna Bradford. She can be reached at brad-ford5753@gmail.com.

"We already have neighborhood association dues. Why should we switch to a CID?"

Morningside currently has a yearly voluntary dues system in place. In 2014 and 2015, out of 539 households, approximately 20% paid dues. Lack of dues received, means less neighborhood services provided. Every Morningside homeowner benefits from neighborhood upkeep and services of our association. These services increase property values and create a stronger com

munity. The CID ensures payment from each homeowner, thereby increasing our budget and creating a fair and equitable environment where the services provided for all aren't being funded by a few.

"How much will by collected from each household for the CID and will that amount ever be raised?"

The amount of the proposed CID is \$50 per household per year. This amount would be automatically added into each households property tax bill each year. The Morningide CID is capped at \$125. Therefore, the CID amount per household could never be raised to exceed \$125 per year. The amount of the CID would not be raised unless choice of neighborhood services, requested and voted on by residents, would require an increase. Even then, the increase would not occur without resident input at yearly meetings.
